#### 2021 ANNUAL DIVERSION/DISPOSAL REPORT TO CALRECYCLE

#### Introduction and Background

Attached for Board review and discussion is the 2021 Annual Report as submitted to CalRecycle on September 29, 2022. This report addresses the region's compliance status relative to the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (AB 939) diversion goal of 50 percent by the year 2000; the compliance status relative to the Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB341), Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 1826) and Short-Lived Climate Pollutants (SLCP) (SB 1383) Laws; the implementation status of Source Reduction and Recycling Element (SRRE) and Household Hazardous Waste Element (HHWE) programs; and related Siting Element and Summary Plan issues. It should be noted that CalRecycle also required extensive reporting in this report on the region's progress/compliance status for the period January through June 2022 relative to the SB 1383 (2016) requirements that became effective January 2022.

With the passage of SB 1016 (2008), compliance with the 50 percent diversion requirement is now based on a per capita disposal figure comparison beginning with the 2007 Annual Report with the focus now on whether diversion programs have been implemented and maintained. This methodology establishes a baseline target per capita disposal figure for every jurisdiction or regional agency that is equivalent to the 50 percent diversion requirement using the average of the base year waste generation amount (disposal + diversion) adjusted for changes in population, taxable sales, employment, and the CPI for the years 2003 through 2006. The baseline target per capita disposal figure remains fixed at this amount.

For the RWMA, the baseline target per capita disposal figure is based on the average of the adjusted waste generation figures for 2005 and 2006 because the RWMA completed a New Base Year Waste Generation Study for 2004. The baseline target per capita disposal figure for the RWMA has been set at 6.9 pounds/person/day or half of the calculated per capita generation figure for the region. The per capita disposal amount for each reporting year (e.g., 2021) is now compared to the 6.9 pounds/person/day baseline target to determine if it is less than (greater than 50 percent diversion) or greater than (less than 50 percent diversion) the target amount.

#### 2021 Annual Report

In 2021, 182,157 tons of waste was reported as disposed of from the six RWMA jurisdictions, although this includes some host assigned waste for the Marysville MRF/Transfer Station and the Recology Ostrom Organics facilities which cannot be deducted per state law. The resulting per capita disposal amount was 5.5 pounds/person/day, well below the baseline target amount of 6.9 pounds/person/day. This figure is equivalent to a diversion rate of 60 percent [13.8 pounds generated (twice the target amount) – 5.5 pounds disposed = 8.3 pounds diverted or 60 percent of the 13.8-pound baseline waste generation amount].

#### Reported Annual Diversion Levels for 1995 Through 2021:

It is important to note that the calculated 2021 diversion rate is based on a comparison to the region's 2004 New Base Year Waste Generation Study which is the basis for the baseline target amount of 6.9 pounds/person/day. The 2004 New Base Year Waste Generation Study included diversion activities conducted by Recology Yuba-Sutter, as well as by individuals, businesses, public agencies, and non-profit organizations that contribute substantial additional diversion efforts separate from Recology Yuba-Sutter.

Separate and unrelated to the state diversion calculation, the Collection Service Agreements adopted by each of the RWMA member agencies include a different diversion rate calculation and a minimum annual diversion requirement of 30 percent based on the materials collected by Recology Yuba-Sutter. The diversion rates for Recology Yuba-Sutter's Fiscal Year 2021 were 30.5% for Yuba City and 26.2% for the other five RWMA jurisdictions based on provisions of the respective collection service agreements. Since Yuba City amended the Collection Service Agreement effective May 1, 2022, the diversion rate will be a combined calculation for all six RWMA jurisdictions going forward.

The following chart presents the disposal amounts for the RWMA jurisdictions for the years 1995 through 2021 and the annual percentage change in the disposal amount from year to year.

#### Reported Annual Disposal for 1995 Through 2021:

Mandatory Recycling and Organics Requirements Reporting

As reflected in the 2021 Annual Report, the state is increasingly focused on compliance with the SB 1383 requirements that became effective January 2022, including initial progress/compliance status reporting for the first half of 2022. At the same time, the state continues to also be focused on compliance with the state's earlier Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 1826) Laws. It is important to note that the Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 1826) Laws still apply in areas granted low population-based waivers

by CalRecycle relative to the SB 1383 organic separation and collection requirements. These areas include four census tracts in the Sutter County Unincorporated Area; six census tracts in the Yuba County Unincorporated Area; and the City of Wheatland.

A total of 1,225 businesses, including schools and agencies, and multi-family housing were identified as being covered by the Mandatory Commercial Recycling Law (AB 341), which means that they have four (4) or more cubic yards of weekly refuse service or are multi-family housing with five (5) or more dwelling units. Of these, 372 were identified as not recycling including those that have not been reached; are located outside the recycling service areas of Yuba and Sutter Counties; do not generate recyclable materials; or, have an unsecured location that would not be practical for recycling services.

For purposes of the Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling Law (AB 1826), organic waste is defined as including food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, nonhazardous wood waste, and food-soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste. Effective September 15, 2020, the threshold for applicability of the Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling Law changed from generation of four (4) or more cubic yards per week of commercial solid waste to two (2) or more cubic yards per week of commercial solid waste to two (2) or more cubic yards per week of commercial solid waste (i.e., refuse + recycling + organics generation) for businesses, including schools and agencies. The same waste generation threshold applies to multi-family housing that has five (5) or more dwelling units, except that the food waste and food-soiled paper components do not apply to multi-family housing. A total of 2,056 businesses, including schools and agencies, and multi-family housing were identified as being covered by the Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling Law in 2021. Of these 1,200 were identified as not recycling organic wastes.

While outreach and education efforts relative to the Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 1826) Laws have been underway for some years, extensive outreach, education, and compliance review activities have recently been initiated as a result of the SB 1383 requirements. These activities are expected to have a positive effect on the compliance figures for the Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling (AB 1826) Laws as entities add recycling services and/or are determined to be exempt.

#### SB 1383 Short-Lived Climate Pollutants (SLCP) January – June 2022 Report

The annual report includes extensive reporting on the various aspects of SB 1383 for the first half of 2022, including recovered organic waste product procurement, edible food recovery, collection systems, Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinances (MWELO), CALGreen project construction and demolition diversion compliance, SB 1383 waivers, and Mandatory Commercial Organic Recycling exemptions and compliance. The reported Short-Lived Climate Pollutants (SB 1383) compliance figures are significantly different than those reported for Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organic Recycling (AB 1826) Laws for the following reasons:

The applicable threshold for Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) compliance is different (4 cubic yards/week of refuse or multi-family housing of 5+ units) than the Mandatory Commercial Organic Recycling (AB 1826) and SB 1383 threshold (2 cubic yards/week of refuse + recycling + organics generation).

- 2) Exemptions from the Mandatory Commercial Organic Recycling (AB 1826) requirements for generating less than 0.5 cubic yards/week of organics are granted on an informal basis. Under SLCP/SB 1383, each of the exempt entities needs to be revisited and reviewed through a formal waiver process which commenced in August 2022 and is ongoing.
- 3) Low population-based waivers for SB1383 applicable to portions of Yuba and Sutter Unincorporated County areas and for the City of Wheatland do not apply to the Mandatory Commercial Recycling (AB 341) and Mandatory Commercial Organic Recycling (AB 1826) requirements.
- 4) In the SB 1383 data, the commercial businesses and multi-family housing counted as NOT recycling organics includes entities that are NOT recycling paper and cardboard and/or other organic materials, such as yard waste, food waste, food soiled paper and wood waste, whereas the AB 341 and AB 1826 figures separately reflect compliance respectively for recycling and organics.
- 5) The SB 1383 data reported is for the first half of 2022 and a substantial effort commenced in the second half of 2022 to assist entities with compliance services, including waiver applications, and the results of this effort will be reflected in future reporting.

For the first half of 2022, a total of 1,610 commercial and multi-family housing entities were included in the SB 1383 Compliance Review (i.e., entities with 2+ cubic yards/week of refuse + recycling + organics generation). A total of 1,368 of these entities were reported as not being compliant although as noted above, a substantial effort commenced in the second half of 2022 to assist entities with compliance services, including waiver applications, and the results of this effort will be reflected in future reporting.

Additionally, the SB 1383 reporting for recovered organic waste product procurement reflects zero (0) procurement for the first half of 2022 and these figures are expected to remain at or close to zero (0) through the end of 2022. A compost purchase rebate program is being developed to provide for recovered organic waste product procurement and is planned to commence in 2023. Recent state legislation, AB 1985 (2022), now phases in the recovered organic waste product procurement target: 30% of the target in 2023; 65% of the target in 2024; and 100% of the target in 2025, and every year thereafter.

Staff will be prepared at the meeting to discuss this report in detail.
